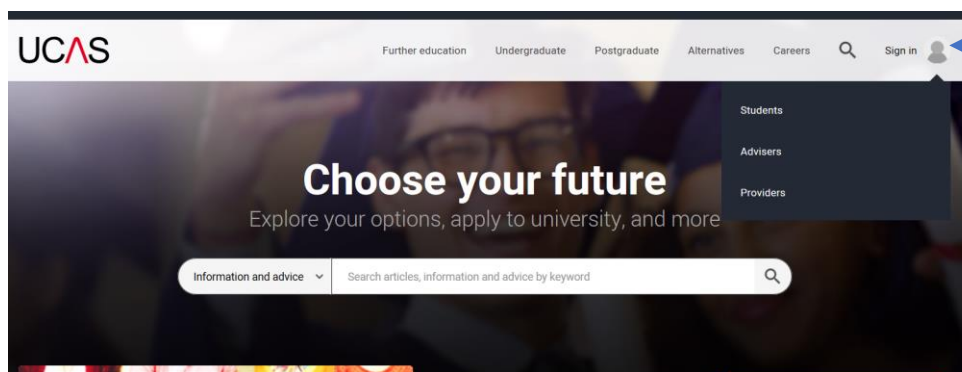


UCAS Step-by-Step Guide for 2022 entry

Before you begin your application look through these instructions and make sure you have gathered the following information in order to complete your application:

- GCSE Certificates showing grades and examining boards
- Any other qualifications, including those taken overseas
- Details of any paid employment (i.e. employers name and address and the date you started/finished)
- If you were not born in the UK, date you entered.
- Credit/debit card to pay online application fee of £26.50 for up to five choices or £22 for one choice
- 15th October by 6.00pm: Deadline for medicine, dentistry, veterinary science and Oxford and Cambridge (**Internal College Deadline – Friday 25th September**)
- 26th January by 6.00pm: Final UCAS deadline (**Internal College Deadline – Friday 5th November: BTEC and A Level Students Friday 5th December: Access and other students on one year courses**)



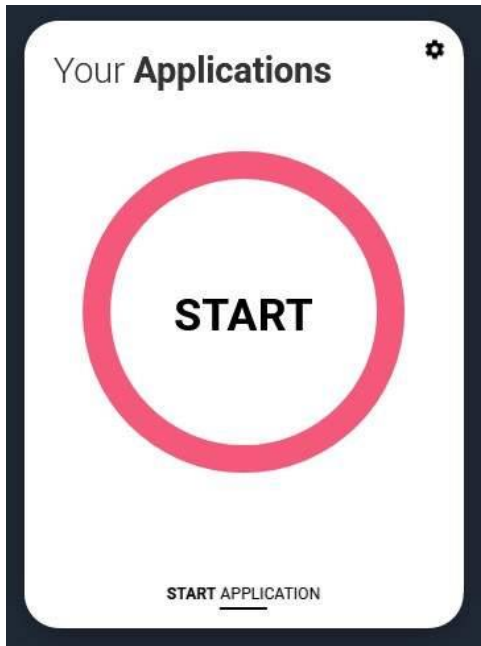

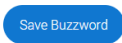

Point of entry
This tells the universities and colleges which year of the course you want to start, e.g. point of entry one is the first year of the course. If you wish to start in the first year of the course leave the box blank and you will automatically be considered for the first year. Enter 0 if you intend to take a foundation year – not all universities offer a foundation year so please check before applying.
If you've spoken to your chosen university or college and they are willing to consider your application to start the course after the first year, please enter the relevant number for the year, e.g. second year = 2, third year = 3, etc.

Type in your choice of University- For some London Universities like Kings College London, type in University of London. There is no need to enter your choices in order of preference- they will appear alphabetically in your application. Your choices should all be similar. Don't apply for courses that are very different as this makes it difficult to write your personal statement. Your choices must be realistic otherwise you may be rejected.

When you have completed all sections of your application and it shows 100% completed you will be able to review and submit from 7th September 2021. You will be asked for online payment at this stage.

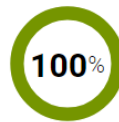

Review & Submit- this will be highlighted from 7th September when submissions can be made.

Once you have submitted your application, it will be released to the college to ensure that your reference and predicted grades are added.

References & Predicted Grades

- A reference is a written recommendation from your teachers outlining your academic abilities and suitability for study at Higher Education.
- Predicted grades are not your target grades.
- Predicted grades are provided by your teachers – these grades are not negotiable. Predicted grades are awarded from teachers based on your performance in lessons and assessments. They will be using their professional judgement based on evidence.

Final Checks

- Once you have submitted your application to us, your application will be given a final check.
- If there are errors, your application will be sent back to you to make the amendments.
- You will need to resubmit your application to us – you will not be required to pay again!

Application Sent!

- Once your application is correct and error free, your application will have the reference and predicted grades added to your application.
- Correct applications will be sent to UCAS within 10 working days.
